The WILL Empower apprenticeship serves as an on-ramp for young women to gain experience and build skills in unions and other worker movement organizations.

Apprentices work full-time for three to twelve months at host sites across the United States.


Apprenticeships focus on a variety of topics such as communications, politics, policy, organizing, and research.


